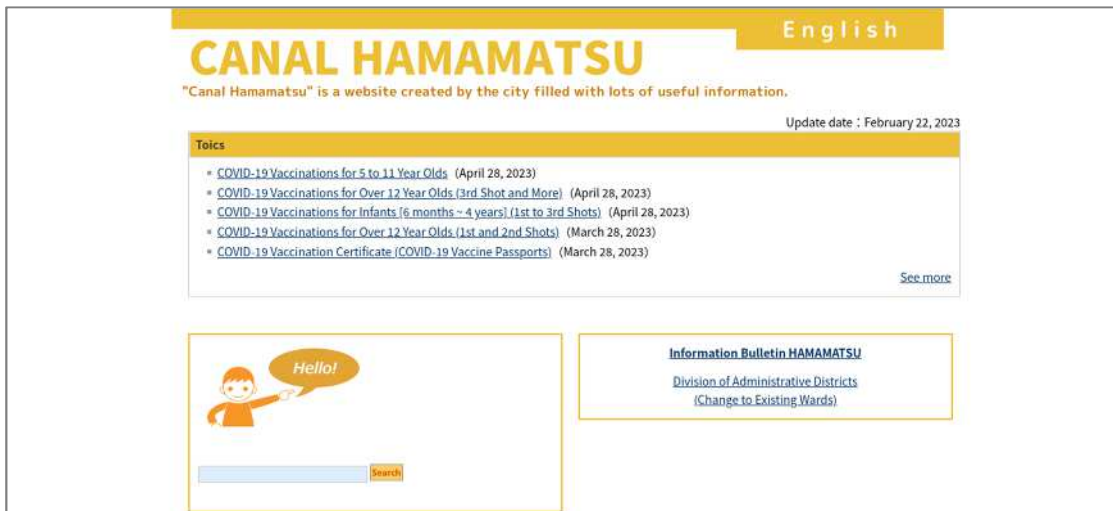

◆ Japanese Language Classes

- The Japanese language classes at U-ToC are for foreign residents aged 16 years or older who are living or working in Hamamatsu, with a curriculum designed to teach Japanese that would be beneficial to their daily lives.
- The facility offers classes designed to reach intermediate level within one year, as well as reading and writing classes.
- There are also cultural exchange classes held in Japanese.

School Enrollment

We encourage all our foreign residents to enroll their children in school as we believe that every child has the right to an education.

In Japan, parents/guardians are obligated to send their children aged between 6 and 15 to school. We have a variety of municipal and private elementary and junior high schools, in addition to schools for foreign residents in Hamamatsu, so there are ample choices of schools to which you can send your children in order to give them the most suitable education.

Private Elementary and Junior High Schools

- ◆ Please contact the desired private elementary and junior schools directly.



Schools for Foreign Residents

- Mainly for foreign residents of South American origin.
- Lessons are held in Portuguese or Spanish.
- The curriculum is different from that of Japanese schools.
- Payment of tuition fees is required.

Traffic Rules in Japan

■ Driving in Japan

◆ Driver's License

You need to carry a driver's license that is valid in Japan.

If you change your address or name, you will also need to update your driver's license as well. Please notify your local police station.

- If you do not have a driver's license from another country
 - You need to get a license by passing Japan's driving tests (aptitude, theory, and practical).
 - It is common for many foreign residents to attend a driving school or a training center, similar to other Japanese residents.
- If you have a driver's license from another country
 - You will be issued a Japanese driver's license if you meet the application requirements, and there are no problems with your documents and test results.
 - Please check the websites of respective police stations/Shizuoka prefectural police headquarters (page 29) for information regarding application requirements and making reservations, and contact them for more details.



◆ Insurance

- You cannot drive a vehicle unless it has undergone a valid inspection. The inspection must be conducted regularly.
- You are obligated by law to get vehicle liability insurance.
- However, vehicle liability insurance (jibaiseki hoken) alone may not be enough to cover all costs in the event of a traffic accident were to happen so we recommend that you also take out voluntary insurance (nin'i hoken).

◆ Registering Your Vehicle

- You cannot drive a vehicle unless it has been registered. To register, you need to secure a place to park the vehicle. You must provide proof at the police station that you have secured a parking space.

◆ Vehicle Tax

- In addition to the vehicle weight tax incurred when getting your vehicle inspected or purchasing a new vehicle, you are also required to pay vehicle tax. A tax payment notification letter will be sent annually to the current registered owner of the vehicle on 1 April. The payment deadline is the end of May. (For new vehicles, you pay at the time of purchase.)

■ Traffic Rules

◆ Basic Traffic Rules

- Please obey traffic signals and road signs.
(Yellow: stop, Red: stay stationary, Green: good to go)
- Please look left and right to ensure it is safe before proceeding forward.
- Pedestrians on the right side, vehicles and bicycles on the left side.
- The safety of pedestrians is the priority when on the road.

◆ Basic Traffic Rules for Vehicles (cars, motorcycles, bicycles)

- Keep in mind your own safety when driving, but also of pedestrians and other drivers.
- Stop before the white line at stop signs and check both the left and right sides of the road.
- Turn your headlights on in the dark.
- Do not drive or ride a bicycle if you have consumed alcohol.
- Stop if there are people or bicycles at the pedestrian crossing.
- Wear a seatbelt inside the vehicle.
- For children under 6 years old, a child seat of a suitable size must be used.
- Do not be distracted by your smartphone or car navigation while driving.
- Do not drive with loud music on your radio or earphones that may distract you from the sounds and voices coming from the road.
- You must wear a helmet when riding a motorcycle or bicycle.



◆ What To Do After An Accident

- In case of an accident, please move your car to a safe place where it is not in the way of other vehicles and turn off the engine to prevent further accidents.
- If someone is injured, please prioritize their safety, apply first-aid and call an ambulance (119).
- Please call the police (110), report the location of the accident, the number of injured persons and the situation, and then follow their instructions.
- Please ask the people around you for help if you cannot contact the police or ambulance yourself.
※ However, if you leave the scene of the accident, the case will be treated as a hit-and-run, so please do not leave the area. Please call your friends for help or interpretation after the police have arrived at the scene of the accident.

◆ Examples of Traffic Regulations and Signs in Japan



■ Obey the Traffic Lights

Not following the traffic lights may lead to an accident.

Ensure to obey the traffic lights even at night.



■ No Entry

This sign shows an exit to a one way road. You can't enter.



■ Railway Level Crossing Signals

If you hear the signal that means a train is coming. Please wait for the train to pass.



■ STOP

Please stop at the white line painted on the road. Check that it is safe before moving.

※ While some signs are similar to the ones back in your home country, there may be some signs that are completely different so please check in advance.

※ **This is only a part of the rules.** Please make sure you learn the traffic rules of Japan before you start driving.

What to Do During an Earthquake

If you feel violent shaking or shaking that continues for an extended period of time, first, take steps to protect yourself from the earthquake tremors. After that, immediately evacuate in case of a tsunami.

■ What to Do During an Earthquake

◆ Protect yourself from the earthquake tremors

- Hide under a desk to protect yourself from falling debris.
- Get away from household furniture and protect yourself at a safe location.
- Do not unreasonably attempt to extinguish fires when the tremors are still ongoing.
- Secure an evacuation route by opening the front door and windows leading outside.

◆ Evacuate from a tsunami

- Immediately evacuate when the tremors have stopped.
 - Evacuate as soon as the tremors stop without waiting for further information such as the tsunami warning.
- Evacuate to the highest place available.
 - Evacuate to the highest place available such as tsunami evacuation facilities and high ground etc.
- If not at home, please evacuate individually.
 - Discuss with your family members and decide on evacuation shelters you can go to whether you are at home, school or work.
- Do not return home until the tsunami warning has been lifted.

■ Earthquake Early Warning

An early earthquake warning will be issued on television, radio or your mobile phones seconds before powerful tremors hit.

■ Staying Safe in Different Situations

In downtown areas

- ◆ Department stores and supermarkets
 - Protect your head with a bag or basket.
 - Leave the sales area and move close to a wall.
 - Do not panic and run outside. Follow the instructions of the staff.
- ◆ Elevators
 - Press all the floor buttons and get off at the floor where it stops.
 - Do not use the elevator after an earthquake.

Traveling

- ◆ On the road
 - Move away from concrete walls, telephone poles, vending machines which may fall over.
 - Be careful of debris falling from above such as shattered glass and sign boards.
 - Go inside a sturdy building and avoid debris.
- ◆ While driving
 - Pull over to the left and slowly come to a stop. Do not leave your car until the shaking stops.
 - Leave your keys in the car and go on foot. (Take your vehicle inspection certificate with you)
- ◆ On the train or bus
 - Hold onto the straps or handles inside the vehicle.
 - Follow the instructions of the staff.

Others

- ◆ At schools
 - Follow the instructions of the teachers.
 - Do not return home until the tsunami warning is lifted. Parents/guardians should not go to pick their children up.
- ◆ Near cliffs
 - Move away from areas which may collapse such as cliff faces and the river banks
- ◆ Fires
 - Evacuate to a big park or open grounds using wide roads if a fire occurs.

Information that will be sent to you

- ◆ Emergency Information
 - Information on disasters such as earthquakes, typhoons, and heavy rainfall
 - Emergency information on evacuation preparation, evacuation advisories/ instructions, Tokai earthquake, etc.
- ◆ Environmental Information
 - Information on air pollution (summer smog), etc.

※There is also an option to choose other types of information which are available only in Japanese.

Residents' Associations

Resident's Associations are groups comprised of those who live in the local area. The residents work together in efforts to create a "safe, bright, and liveable city".

Let's build a safe, secure, bright, and beautiful community!

◆ Disaster Preparedness and Cooperation Activities

- Put effort into activities which would ensure one's safety in the event of an earthquake or other natural disasters.
- Play an important role in the event of an earthquake.
- Organize disaster drills for earthquakes and other natural disasters, as well as stockpile disaster supplies.

◆ Security Measures

- Install and maintain security lights so that people can walk the streets safely at night.

◆ Environmental Beautification

- Clean the roads and parks in the local area to keep the environment beautiful.

◆ Rubbish Collection Site Management

- Arrange for rubbish collection sites to be set up by the city for everyone to use, and take turns keeping the site clean.

◆ Recycling Activities

- Collect recyclables such as cans, bottles and newspapers from households so that they can be reused.

◆ Association Activities

- Promote and support various groups in the local area such as children's associations, and senior citizens' clubs.

◆ Security Measures

- Install and maintain security lights so that people can walk the streets safely at night.

◆ Cultural and Recreational Activities

- Organize activities in which anyone can participate such as sports festivals, cultural festivals, Obon dances etc. to promote friendly relations between residents.

Minding Your Manners

Hamamatsu City Comfortable & Pleasant Lifestyle Environment Protection Ordinance (Citizens' Manners Ordinance)

■ Our Request to our Residents

In order to create a more pleasant living environment for its residents, Hamamatsu has introduced regulations which prohibit the following five actions. Manners are not simply what people tell you to do. Keep in mind actions you find disruptive or unpleasant and do not do such things to others.

■ Actions Prohibited by Hamamatsu Regulations

◆ Littering with cigarette butts and empty cans

- Please refrain from littering in public spaces and ensure to bring your rubbish home with you or dispose of it in a rubbish bin.
- Please help us keep our local area clean!



◆ Smoking

- To prevent burns, please do not smoke while walking or riding a bicycle.
- Please only smoke at places which have been fitted with an ashtray.



◆ Graffiti

- Please refrain from graffitiing!
- Graffiti is a crime that not only affects the owners of the vandalized property, but it is also unpleasant for the people who have to look at it.



◆ Bad Pet Owner Etiquette

- It is the owner's responsibility to pick up their dog or cat's droppings. Please pick up your pet's droppings during your walk and bring it home.
- For cat owners, please do not let your cat out of the house.



◆ **Inappropriate Usage of Disabled Parking Spaces**

- These parking spaces are reserved for those with disabilities.
Please use them appropriately.



◆ **Disabled Parking Spaces**

Disabled parking spaces are wider and more easily accessible to accommodate wheelchair users boarding and disembarking their vehicles.

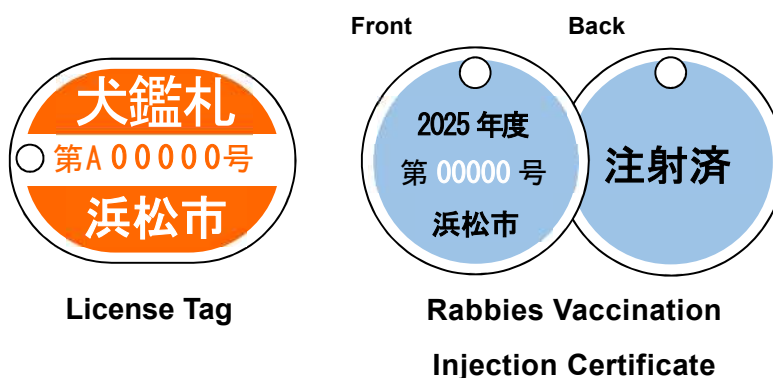

- Please attach a license tag and rabies vaccination certificate to your dog's collar.



■ **Keep Your Pets Safe**

Dogs must be kept on a leash when on a walk or in the garden.

Cats should be kept indoors at all times.

■ **Be Considerate of Others**

Please ensure that noise or odors from droppings do not cause inconvenience for others.

Please pick up after your dog outside.

■ **Runaway Pets**

If your cat or dog runs away, please contact the Animal Protection & Education Center. (Tel.:053-487-1616).

■ Collection of Miscellaneous Recyclable Paper

- All recyclable paper excluding newspapers, magazines, cardboard, and cartons are categorized as “Miscellaneous Paper.”
- Please recycle newspapers, magazines, cardboard, cartons, and miscellaneous paper at the appropriate sites and using the methods mentioned below.
 - 1 Recyclables collection groups (Residents’ Associations, children’s associations, PTAs from school, etc.)
 - 2 Municipal recycling stations (ward offices, Community Collaboration Centers, etc.)
 - 3 Private recycling stations (supermarkets, pharmacies, and open recycling stations)

※Please be aware that some items may not be accepted depending on the station.

Please dispose of dirty paper with grease or strong smells, carbon or tracing paper, shredded paper, and waterproof paper along with your burnable rubbish.

Separating your miscellaneous paper from your burnable rubbish will reduce its size and weight so it may make throwing out your rubbish easier!

■ Collecting Used Tempura Oil

City facilities are collecting used vegetable-based cooking oil from households. Please remove any bits of food and bring it to the collection point in a container or PET bottle.

※Please bring the container or PET bottle home with you.

Collected Oils: Rapeseed oil, corn oil, sesame oil, rice-bran oil, soybean oil, sunflower oil, olive oil

(We also collect expired oil, and unused food oils.)

※We do not collect animal oil, petroleum, fuel, or chemical products that have solidified.



■ Collecting Small Electronic Appliances

City facilities have small collection boxes to help recycle small electronic appliances found at home.

List of Items Collected:

Small devices such as mobile phones, laptops, tablets, HDD recorders, BD recorder/players, video tape recorders, digital cameras, film cameras, game consoles, and phones.

Size Limit:

Maximum depth, length, width of 15cm x 60cm x 30 cm or smaller.



Collection Point:

There are over 55 facilities such as ward offices, Community Collaboration Centers, citizen service centers, Fureai centers, etc.

Please cooperate in separating your rubbish!

Illegal disposal of rubbish is a crime!

Individual Resident Tax (Juminzei)

■ What is Individual Resident Tax?

In Japan, there are two types of taxes relating to personal income: Income Tax (national tax) and Individual Resident Tax (local tax). Payment of both taxes is compulsory. The tax paid to Hamamatsu City is the Individual Resident Tax (local tax). The Individual Resident Tax is divided into and calculated under Municipal Tax and Prefectural Tax, and collected in total by Hamamatsu City.

■ Those Required to Pay Individual Resident Tax

Those who reside in Hamamatsu as of January 1 of the current year are subject to this tax.

The tax amount is determined by income earned in the previous year (between January and December).

In cases where one leaves Hamamatsu after January 1, either to another city or abroad, they are still required to pay that year's tax in full to Hamamatsu City.

Furthermore, if you leave Japan, we will ask for the full payment of the tax amount. There is a "tax agent system" available and a representative can act on your behalf with regard to taxation matters. Please contact the Hamamatsu City Municipal Tax Division.

■ How to Calculate Individual Resident Tax

Individual Resident Tax has both an income-based levy and capita-based levy.

The total amount from the calculation of both rates becomes your annual tax amount.

- ① Income-based Levy ... Tax amount is calculated based on your income in the previous year.

The Forest Environment Tax (national tax) is a tax that is paid in conjunction with your per capita-based levy residence tax starting from the fiscal year of 2025.

■ Period for Tax Payment and Payment Method

Special collection . . . Tax payment will be divided into 12 installments and deducted automatically from salaries from June to May of the following year.

★ The special collection generally applies to salaried workers.

Ordinary collection . . . Tax payment will be divided into 4 installments over a period of one year. Tax payment notices will be sent out by the City.

(The deadline for payments are June 30, August 31, October 31 and January 31.)

※ If the payment deadline date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the due date will be adjusted to the following business day.

■ Taxation Certificates and Certificates of Tax Payment

★ A taxation certificate and a certificate of tax payment, or Certificate of Tax Exemption, are required when foreign residents renew their status of residence.

Please be sure to pay your Individual Resident Tax by the due date.

In addition, it may take a few days to issue a certificate in the event of changes to an individual's tax situation (i.e, individuals who have not made a declaration, or have had changes to their income or number of dependants).

Light Motor Vehicle Tax (Keijidoshazei)

- Owners of motorcycles or light motor vehicles as of April 1 need to pay Light Motor Vehicle Tax (differs according to the type of vehicle).
- A notification form for tax payment will be sent to you annually in mid-May. Please pay the tax at one of the designated locations (banks, trust banks, post offices, or convenience stores) by **May 31**. If the date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the deadline will be moved to the following Monday.
- If you have mental or physical disabilities, you can apply for tax exemption. Please apply at least 7 days before the deadline. For more details, please enquire at the Municipal Tax Division at the City Hall.

■ FAQ

? Why did I still receive a payment notification form even though I have already decommissioned my motorcycle or light motor vehicle?

- All residents with a registered light motor vehicle as of April 1 are required to pay Light Motor Vehicle Tax. If you dispose of your vehicle after April 1, you will still have to pay one year's worth of tax.

? How do I dispose of my motorcycle or light motor vehicle?

- Carry out vehicle disposal procedures. Please check the table below and contact the relevant office in advance to confirm the location, the reception times, and what you need to bring.
As for the vehicle itself, please bring it to a motorcycle/automobile dealer or a scrapyard and dispose of it appropriately.

? I want to give my motorcycle/light motor vehicle to someone else, what do I do?

- If you are transferring ownership of a motorcycle with a capacity of 0.5L or below to a registered resident of Hamamatsu, you will need the inkan (seal) of the current owner and the new owner, as well as the license plate certificate.
- For vehicles other than motorbikes, check the table below and contact the relevant office in advance to confirm the location, the reception times, and what you need to bring.

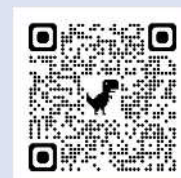

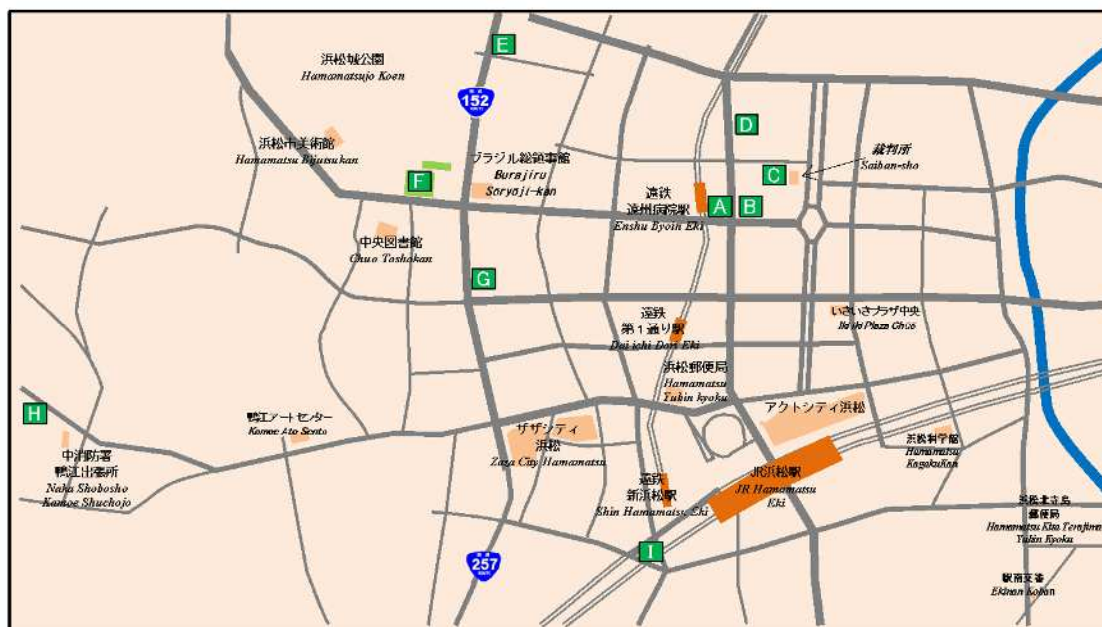
