

Q. Will services change when a Community Collaboration Center becomes a Branch Office?

A. The names of the Maisaka, Inasa, Mik-kabi, Haruno, Sakuma, Misakubo, and Tatsuyama Community Collaboration Centers will change to Branch Offices. However, they will continue to provide the same services as when they were a Community Collaboration Center, and at the same location.



Q. After reorganization, will I no longer be able to do procedures without going to the ward office?

A. The Higashi, Nishi, Minami and Kita Ward Offices will be renamed Higashi, Nishi, Minami and Kita Administrative Centers, respectively. However, they will continue to provide the same services as the ward office, with the same location and operations.



Q. Is there a nearby facility other than the Ward Office or Administrative Center where I can do procedures?

A. General procedures for family registers, Notification and Issuance of Certificates of Residence, as well as personal seal registration, tax certificates, welfare, and National Health Insurance can also be done at Branch Offices, Community Collaboration Centers, Fureai Community Centers, and Municipal Services Centers even after the reorganization. Addresses of Branch Offices and Community Collaboration Centers are listed on pages 20 and 21, and procedure items and handling locations are listed on pages 22 and onwards.



Q. If the ward name changes due to ward reorganization, will I need to change my address?

A. In most cases, a change of address due to a change of ward name is not necessary for the family register, Certificate of Residence or driver's licence. Details are posted on pages 8 to 10, as well as on the city's website and in videos.
